

ORDINANCE NO. 15
NUISANCE ORDINANCE

An Ordinance to Provide the exercise of certain Municipal powers of the Township of Rollin to Promote the health, safety, and welfare of persons and property in the Township and to provide penalties for the violation of the provisions thereof.

The Township of Rollin ordains:

SECTION 1. NUISANCE DEFINED AND PROHIBITED

Whatever injures or endangers the safety, health, comfort or repose of the public; interferes with, obstructs or renders dangerous any street, highway or stream; or in any way renders the public insecure in life and property is hereby declared to be a public nuisance. Public nuisances shall include, but not be limited to, whatever is forbidden by a provision by this Ordinance. No person shall commit, create or maintain any public nuisance.

SECTION 2. PENALTY

Every person convicted of a violation of any provision of this Ordinance or any rule or regulation adopted or issued in pursuance thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars and costs of prosecution or imprisonment for not more than Ninety (90) days or by both such fine and imprisonment. Each act of violation and every days upon which any such violation shall occur shall constitute a separate offense. The imposition of any such sentence shall not exempt the offender from compliance with the Ordinance.

SECTION 3. INJUNCTIVE RELIEF

As a cumulative remedy to the section above entitled "PENALTY", any violation of the provisions of this Ordinance is a public nuisance and any person who violates any provision of this Ordinance may be made a defendant in a suit in the Lenawee County Circuit Court. The Township of Rollin shall have the power, through its attorneys, to request the circuit court to issue an injunction compelling the defendant to forthwith comply with this Ordinance. The Township shall be entitled to receive actual attorney fees expended for enforcement of this Ordinance from any person found to be in violation.

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY

If any court of law or equity within the State of Michigan determines that any part of this Ordinance is unconstitutional, void, voidable, or unenforceable, the remaining provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed separate, distinct and valid in all respects from said provision.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after its publication.
