ROLLIN TOWNSHIP BUILDING NUMBERING ORDINANCE  
ORDINANCE # 24

INTENT

AN ORDINANCE TO PROTECT THE HEALTH, SAFETY AND GENERAL WELFARE OF PERSONS AND PROPERTY WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF ROLLIN, COUNTY OF LENAWE, BY ADOPTION OF REGULATIONS REQUIRING THE LOCATION OF IDENTIFICATION NUMBERS UPON BUILDINGS AND PREMISES WITH THE TOWNSHIP; TO IMPOSE PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF OF; AND TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES OF PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH.

THE TOWNSHIP OF ROLLIN, COUNTY OF LENAWE, MICHIGAN ORDAINS:

Section 1: NAME

This Ordinance shall hereafter be known and cited as the Rollin Township Building Numbering Ordinance # 24.

Section 2: PURPOSE:

The purpose of this Ordinance is to protect the public health, safety and general welfare of the persons and property within the Township of Rollin by requiring proper identification numbers (number, not lettering,) to be located upon buildings and premises within the Township so that the same can be readily identifiable for proper and efficient fire and police protection; for mail delivery services and the convenience of all members of the public having any need to determine or describe the location of such buildings or premises.

Section 3: REGULATIONS

A. The owner or resident of all premises within the Township of Rollin improved with buildings or occupied for public business purposes shall securely affix thereon a proper identification number (minimum size shall be 3 inches) as determined and assigned by The Consumers Power Company which can be easily read from the abutting street upon which the property fronts.

B. Where a multiple number of buildings are assigned one identification number, each building shall be assigned a further number or letter by The Consumers Power Company or Rollin Township in the event that the owner or resident of the same have not located an appropriate identification number or letter upon the premises occupied by each such building. Such identification of a multiple number of buildings shall not, however, apply to outbuildings which are subordinate and incidental the principal building upon the premises and which do not exceed three in number.


Section 4: PENALTY

Any person, firm or corporation which violates any of the provisions of the Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of up to \$100.00 Each day that a violation continues shall be considered a separate offense.

Section 5: EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effective 30 days after publication. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
